Between 1978 and 1998, Fernando Urbina Rangel, a philosopher and ethnographer at the National University of Colombia, took a series of photographs in the Colombian Amazonia, in Lindosa region of Colombia. They present the traditional beliefs and knowledge of the indigenous populations of the region through the rock representations of their ancestors.

The exhibition *Art and Biodiversity: A Tribute to Amazonian Rock Art* explores the world view of Amazonian indigenous communities, whose entire lives are based on respect for nature and biodiversity, while offering a reflection on the place of biodiversity in contemporary art.
